The children were set the task of designing a poster to display in Moor Mead Park and other open spaces along the river. Six entries were chosen and put up in the park to encourage the proper use of rubbish bins and recycling of waste.


The posters indicate how strongly the children feel about the topic. Later in the summer a small team will take part in a litter picking activity in the park.
