### Crane Valley Planning Guidelines

This Newsletter has been prepared to let you know about the “**Crane Valley Planning Guidelines**”, released by The London Borough Of Richmond Upon Thames for public consultation on 4<sup>th</sup> October. This document will have a major influence on the amount and nature of development in the lower Crane Valley between London Road and Kneller Gardens. If you live in this area and/or care about its future then this provides an opportunity to influence its development.

The AGM also formally adopted a governing document. This constitution will be included in the application to the Charity Commission to register as a Charity. The governing Objects of FORCE, included in the constitution, were also agreed after discussion as:

- *“To operate for the benefit of the public, and with other interested parties, to protect and enhance the environment of the River Crane, the Duke of Northumberland’s River, their corridors and surrounding open spaces within the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames and its environs, for the benefit of the eco-system, residents and visitors”*
- *“To advance the education of the public in the ecology, conservation, protection and improvement of the environment of the River Crane, the Duke of Northumberland’s River, their corridors and surrounding open spaces within the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames and its environs.”*

### Volunteer Days

We held a Volunteer Day in **Crane Park** on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October. This was our first Volunteer Day in the park. We improved access along the pathway by the river to the east of the shot tower. In addition, we opened up the views of the river, thereby also increasing light penetration to the river bank and creating a more varied habitat.

This is the start of a longer-term plan to provide a patchwork of habitats along and local to the river, including reed beds and meadowland. This will provide opportunities for local migration to species breeding on the Crane Park Island Nature Reserve such as water voles, reed warblers and kingfishers. All the work is being implemented with the agreement and approval of the Council.

We plan to hold further volunteer days on the **second Sunday** of each month throughout the autumn and winter and the programme to date is as follows:
