







Key Features

Community and Education Friends of the River Crane Environment Walks and Talks 2017-2018





- 20 FREE guided walks and talks
- Attended by 288 people including 60 children

Community and Education Community Projects 2017-2018



Highlights of 2017-8 included:

- Funding for the Richmond Green Gym based at Mereway Nature Park and Meadway Orchard. This project reopened in October 2017.
- Funding from Thames Water for a new community engagement project of 16 workshops in partnership with TCV.
- Installation of the interpretation for the Duke's River Project
- Reworking of the Lower River Crane and new maps







- item 5.1
