

# Fungus Foray on 19 October 2016 Crane Park island Local Nature Reserve & Crane Park

## Led by Andy Overall, London Fungus Group.

## The foray with FORCE and interested public members identified the following fungi:

Crane Park Island – area immediately over bridge and path by river

Auricularia mesenterica	Tripe Fungus	inside old hollow willow
Laccaria laccata	Deceiver	in grass near oak
Inocybe sp.	-	in grass near oak
Trametes gibbosa	Lumpy bracket	on trunks of living crack willow
Leratiomyces ceres	Redlead Roundhead	on woodchip
Pluteus cervinus	Shield	on woodchip
Mycena sp.	-	in grass
Ganoderma australe	Ganoderma	on willow
Ramaria stricta	-	on woody debris under English elm hedge

#### **Crane Park** – northern end.

Mixed deciduous woodland with ivy, bramble, nettle ground cover.
